Priorities

Someone once said that in order to see a man's priorities, you just have to look at his checkbook and his calendar. How we spend our time and our money seems to reflect most accurately what is truly important to us. So my challenge for August is this: as you set up your schedule for the coming school year, take an in-depth look at your calendar and your checkbook and see what they tell you about your priorities.

As a youth pastor for the last 12 years, one of the most difficult things was to come to grips with the fact that for most youth in our culture, Youth Group is a "fourth-tier" activity in their lives. That means that there are 3 other areas in life that take precedence over it. In our ten years, the first priority is usually school. Very few things can take us away from school and homework – this is a "first-tier" activity. Next usually comes extra-curricular activities such as sports, music, drama, etc. We won't miss school for them (will we?) and regardless of our schedule, we still have to get our homework done, but beyond that, nothing gets in the way of our sports, play practices, concerts... – this is a "second-tier" activity. Friends are typically the third tier, where parties and "just hanging out" take over the remainder of our schedule. Finally, church activities like youth group and retreats get whatever time is left. Once the teens get older and you have to add work and possibly dating, there is little if any time left for church.

So let's personalize this: what "tier" does church take in your life and the life of your family? What is there that will take precedence over gathering as a Hillcrest family on Sunday morning, Wed. night or other times of the week? If the choice is between sleeping in with your visiting family or going to church, which do you choose? What if the kids have a game or practice that night? What about the Bears game that starts at 11am Sunday? Or the party that lasted until 1am and left us so tired?

The question is important because it has to do with every aspect of our Christian walk. Obviously, how involved we are in the church affects our Fellowship. After all, we can't share our lives with people we don't see very often or talk with on a regular basis. But it also affects our Discipleship (What are we teaching our children about the importance of church?), our Worship (we can't worship corporately when we are alone), our Outreach (what do others see about the importance of God in our lives?) and our Service (we can do so much more together).

So one last time I ask, what level of priority does church play in your life? I would encourage you to sit down with last year's calendar and prayerfully see what takes precedence over church and church-related activities. Once you have a good snapshot of the "tiers" in your life, I encourage you to move church up one tier. Try saying, "No, I can't do that. I have church that night." There are a wide variety of opportunities to take part in the Fellowship of Hillcrest Covenant Church to choose from this year. From Sunday school and worship each Sunday to our Wed. night AWANA and DC programs to small groups and bible studies to special events, let me encourage you to take one more step of involvement somewhere in the life of the church this year.

It will require sacrifice as any good thing does. It may mean not being able to participate in all of the activities that we want to do. But the relationships we build (Fellowship), the things we learn (Discipleship) and do (Service, Evangelism and Worship) with others in the Christian community are the only things that are going to go with us into our eternal life. Once in heaven, it won't matter whether we made the game (or even the team), worked that extra day or got one more good night's sleep. Hebrews 10:25 says, "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching." Please be encouraged that God is waiting to lead you one step closer to Him at Hillcrest Covenant Church this year.

At this months meeting we discussed the planning calendar for 2009 and agreed on the following:

- We are planning four Congregational “Town Hall” meeting that will provide feedback on specific issues and where we can listen to any and all concerns of the congregation. We are tentatively planning on having these meeting in the homes of members on September 15,20,23,25. Everyone will be invited to sign up for the one that works best for them. **If you would be interested in hosting one of these meeting please let me or anyone on the Executive Committee know.**
- The budget committee will begin meeting in mid-September. Larry Schultz will be leading this committee that will consist of a representative from each church board, Amy Wessel and Steve Klopfenstein as members at large and Ann Carrel.
- In mid-October we will have an Executive Committee retreat to discuss the learning's from the town hall meetings, review 2009 goals the overall congregation and for each of the committee, and review the proposed budget.
- In mid-November we will have a church board meeting where members off all the church boards will be able to provide input on the 2009 overall goals, goals of each committee, and proposed budget.
- As usual we will have a Congregational meeting in mid-January where we will review the 2008 accomplishments and 2009 goals each committee and approve the 2009 budget. At this meeting the congregational will be able to see how we have incorporated the feedback received in September into the 2009 plans. As with last years meeting, we plan to have some time for breakout groups to discuss key issues for 2009.

It seems early to start thinking about 2009, but it will be here before we know it. I will provide more details on the final dates for all these meetings in my next month's report. If you have questions or comments on these plans please talk to me, Larry or any of the Executive Committee members. As I mentioned earlier the goal of all these activities is to build us up both individually and as a body of Christ. What a great opportunity and challenge that provides all of us.

TRUSTEES' REPORT

The restroom renovation project is essentially complete. As of this writing, there remain a few finish items that should be completed by month-end. Thank you for your patience and understanding during the period of construction.

The six month financial reports indicate that our total cash flow this year has been basically on budget. Winter weather increased our church maintenance and utility spending, but the absence of a budgeted youth pastor has offset these amounts. Looking forward to the balance of the year, new programs such as Awana and increased spending for our Anniversary events will require somewhat above budget giving to balance them out. We expect to see this increased giving to come from a combination of new members and friends and incremental giving increases from current members.

ADOPT AN AREA

The Board of Trustees has proposed, and the Executive Board has endorsed, a new initiative to improve the maintenance of our church facility. This initiative, known as "Adopt An Area," is outlined below:

Purpose: To enroll the members and friends of Hillcrest Covenant in maintaining God's House as a place appropriate for worship and fellowship.

Concept: Groups of Hillcrest members/friends assume personal responsibility for the appearance and condition of a specific area of our Church property. The composition of a "group" could range from a single individual to several families. The "areas" would encompass both the Church interior space and its exterior landscaping. The "group" would be responsible for checking the condition of the area at least 2-3 times a month. The "group" would undertake a spring and fall cleaning of the area, as well as interim "pick-ups" as necessary. The "group" would note necessary clean-ing and maintenance items—performing them to the extent of their ability and noting for Trustee Board action items re-quiring further attention. The "group" would liaison with a designated member of the Board of Trustees. The "group" would be reimbursed for out of pocket expenses. The "group's" commitment would be for 12 months.

Sander Family Missionary Letter

July 2008

Dear Covenant Church Family,

We praise God for what has happened! 15 hostages were rescued! They had been held captive by rebel soldiers, some for over five years and others for over 10 years, including three men from the U.S. No one was hurt in the rescue. No one was injured. No one was shot. Not one drop of blood was spilled. Operation Checkmate was a clever rescue operation, one of tricks and smoke screens where the rebel soldiers were completely fooled. It was carried off so well that even the 15 hostages didn't know they were being rescued until they were flying away in a helicopter and were told that they were no longer captives, but they were free!

Well, of course the country of Colombia is celebrating today. It is a cautious celebration because it caught everyone by surprise. You can't publicize that a rescue attempt is planned. You can only hope and pray that it happens. And millions of Colombians have been praying precisely for that for many years. Today their prayers were answered.

In all of the newscasts and televised encounters between the hostages and their families and loved ones, there were some themes repeated that were very special. All of the hostages thanked God for making it happen. Everyone thanked the army for pulling off one of the more ingenious and clean rescues in the history of the world – literally. The hostages thanked all Colombians for never giving

up on them. The Virgin Mary was thanked. The President was thanked and the Minister of Defense was thanked. But there were also other words spoken. Words of concern for the hostages still held captive and requests of prayer that they continue alive. Words of concern and words of consolation for those people and families who have suffered the loss of a loved one because of this civil war. Words of concern and sadness for the rebels who are having to face hardship, along with the hostages still captive, just to stay alive. It is getting harder and harder for the rebels to keep up their war on Colombia. Words of thanks to the Colombian army that no one was hurt in the operation—not one hostage, not one rebel soldier. Words of encouragement to Colombians everywhere to keep up the hope and to keep up the efforts to bring lasting peace to Colombia.

We didn't know any of the people held captive. But we had been praying for them, along with our Colombian brothers and sisters, and we recognized their faces from the photos we had seen of them. And we were glued to the television and overcome with emotion when we called our kids to tell them to get online and check out the news coming out of Colombia.

It has been a good day to be in Colombia.
